

Fire safety awareness & risk recognition for housing professionals

26 October 2017

This course has been developed to provide housing staff with the knowledge to identify householders who are most at risk from fire, and to consider the options to reduce the risk of injury to the tenant and damage to the property from fire.

The half day course will examine fire safety legislation relating to HMOs in Northern Ireland, examine the responsibilities of landlords, managers and maintenance staff in respect of life safety systems and in the aftermath of the recent tragic Grenfell Tower fire, review the use of the 'Stay Put' policy in place within this housing sector.

More generally, this course will be of benefit to all those working in the housing sector as it provides an awareness of fire safety that can be applied to all domestic situations.

Both have worked on national groups feeding into revisions of British Standards and Approved Documents guidance and both have led on risk reduction strategies within NIFRS aimed at reducing fire calls, fire fatalities and the destruction of property from
