Building Resilience and Connection through Collaborative Learning

How to collaborate with a school in the Global South

Option 1: Form an Online Cluster Partnership

We can help you form an online cluster partnership and support you with an application for funding from the British Council. We'll assist you with implementation of a collaborative pupil project - and provide resources too.

Option 2: Form a Cluster Partnership with Reciprocal School Visits

You'll get everything that's in Option 1, but as soon as it's safe to travel funding also covers reciprocal visits, where you and your partner school can get together and learn firsthand from one another in a two-way exchange trip.



Option 3: Supported Partnerships

Without having to apply for grant funding, you will be supported to form a cluster with NI and International Schools to work together in a project related to one of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) relevant to COP26, the upcoming UN Climate Change Conference.

Learning Objectives and Outcomes

Pupils will:

- Collaborate virtually with peers in the global south to develop knowledge, skills and dispositions for active global citizenship
- Develop wellbeing, resilience and confidence skills, so they can connect better with each other and the world around them during this unprecedented time of lockdowns and remote learning
