At BBC NI our aim is to provide something of value for everyone – to inform and stimulate debate, to celebrate cultural life and diversity, to describe and explain stories, issues and events involving local people, and to provide memorable viewing and listening experiences for audiences in Northern Ireland and throughout the rest of the UK.

Staff at BBC should represent the full diversity of society, and our content should reflect the lives and experiences of local communities, including in minority language programming such as Irish, Ulster-Scots and Cantonese.

The BBC offices in Northern Ireland have approximately 640 staff and our objective is the recruitment, retention and development of a diverse team where everyone feels included, valued and that they belong.

You will mainly be based in one of the BBC NI locations, there is also the option for some home working as agreed by your Dept.

We are currently carrying out a major refurbishment / upgrade of our Broadcasting House site to future proof it for our audiences and staff. We aim to create a more collaborative and flexible working environment for our staff that better enables hybrid working.

How it will work...

You will be given a line manager. You will never be left on your own to do something you aren't comfortable with or haven't been trained to do.

It will be hands on and you can learn as you go or develop the skills you might already have.

We don't expect you to know everything when you start with us; that's what this internship is for. All we ask is that you come ready and willing to learn.

You will have regular check in's with your line manager and a buddy so you have lots of support along the way.

We also have various Staff Networks, including EMBRACE for individuals from Black, Asian, or minority ethnic backgrounds. These networks offer peer support, and you are welcome to join any or all of them. It's a great way to make friends and learn about events.
